


GET STARTED IN AMATEUR RADIO

Morse code is no longer required by the FCC. Simply pass a 35 question multiple choice test to earn your entry level "Technician" license which gives you every Amateur privilege above 30 Megahertz (MHz) including the popular 2 meter band.

Open the door to a new hobby and make new friends. With your

Technician license and access to local 2 meter repeaters, you may stay in touch with other local hams and learn more radio skills if you like. Technicians may operate using Voice modes such as FM or single sideband (SSB), digital- such as packet (via computers), Television (ATV), and even communicate via Amateur Satellite (AMSAT®) with very modest and inexpensive equipment.

You may get started by finding a local club to help you study and administer the FCC required test.


MCARA was formed in 1976 and is the oldest ham radio club in Martin County.
